SALT LAKE GIRL AND JAP FINALLY MARRIED

Salt Lake, Sept. 25—After several weeks of weeping and traveling about the country in an effort to find a county clerk willing to issue them a marriage license, Miss Rayda Reed of Salt Lake and Kuncu Toda, a Japanese merchant, giving his address as Los Angeles, were fortunate Wednesday in Tacoma, Wash., and they were married. The ceremony which united the white girl and the Japanese as man and wife was performed at Tacoma by the Rev. T. Takakashi.
The couple first came into the limelight a week ago when advices were received in Salt Lake from Oakland that they had made application for a license, which was refused. The father of the girl was finally located in Millard county and he telegraphed the Oakland police that as his daughter was of age he could do nothing to prevent the marriage, but recommended her arrest if there was any law on which she could be held. As there was nothing to hold the couple the Oakland police released them.
On Tuesday, Toda and the girl were refused a marriage license in Seattle and they went to Tacoma, where Wednesday they were successful in securing the necessary permit. The deputy clerk of the court at Tacoma, who issued the license, said there was no law against it.
Toda and his wife expect to make their home in Los Angeles.

RAILROAD MUST PAY FOR PUTTING WOMAN OFF TRAIN

Salt Lake, Sept. 29—The Oregon Short Line Railroad company must pay Mrs. Slater, wife of Thomas Slater, \$10,000 for putting her off a train in the rain in a lonely and strange place four miles north of Dayton, Ida., when she had bought and paid for a ticket to Dayton. This was the decision of a jury in District Judge Armstrong's court Wednesday.
