BETTER MAIL SERVICE TO THE ANTIPODES

Washington, Nov. 7.—The United States is to have better mail communication hereafter with New Zealand and points in Australia, according to a report from Consul General John B. Bray, at Sydney, Australia, announcing the completion of arrangements for a new steamship service to San Francisco. A boat will leave Auckland, N. Z., every four weeks. It will connect with a steamship from Sydney, leaving five days earlier, so that the time of the new service will be twenty-two days from New Zealand and twenty-seven days from Sydney.
