DARROW IN QUIZ CHAIR

Noted Attorney Testifies in His Own Defense in Bribe Case.

Los Angeles, July 30.—Refutation of one of the most damaging accusations of Bert H. Franklin—that Clarence S. Darrow had first talked with him about bribing jurors on October 5, 1911, and had given him a check for that purpose on the following day—was furnished by the defendant when he resumed the stand today in his trial for alleged bribery.

Most of those who have occupied the seats were friends or sympathizers of the defendant. District Attorney Fredericks protested against what he asserted was a speech by the defendant. He asked that Darrow be treated as any other witness, instead of being allowed to make a running statement or a speech. A violent controversy arose throughout which the defendant sat smiling and apparently unconcerned.

Los Angeles, Cal., July 30.—Clarence S. Darrow, who is on trial for the alleged bribery of jurors in the McNamara trial, went on the witness stand shortly after 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon and began his attack by way of testimony, on the case built up against him by the prosecution.

Darrow with flushed face, directed his testimony straight to the jury. In answer to questions by Earl Rogers, his chief counsel, he named the big labor cases in which he has been concerned, either as counsel or arbitrator, and mentioned the various public positions he has held. His story

English Court of Inquiry Gives Causes of Great Disaster London, July 30.—The judgment of the English board of trade court of inquiry into the disaster of the White Star liner Titanic, which was sunk in mid-ocean with 1,317 souls, after collision with an iceberg on April 14, was pronounced today by Lord Mersey, the presiding judge, before a large audience.

The court finds that the collision with the iceberg was due to excessive speed; that a proper watch was not kept; that the ship's boats were properly lowered, but that arrangements for manning were insufficient; that the Leyland liner California might have reached the Titanic if she had attempted to do so; that the track followed was really safe with proper
