

DAMAGE TO CROPS AND ROADS

The very heavy storms of last week have done much damage to grain and other crops throughout Davis county. Standing wheat and barley, on account of being over-ripe, have been shelled out by the gusty winds and heavy downpour and in some cases the loss will be half of the crop.

The work of retaining the county road two miles south of Kayaville is progressing, but automobiles are still making a detour of several miles through West Farmington and West Kayaville in order to make the trip from Ogden to Salt Lake.

BUCKHORN VALLEY TO BE RECLAIMED

The Buckhorn Fruit Lands company and the Ariel Fruit Lands company are two new enterprises in Utah. The two companies in reality are one, so far as the purposes of the promoters are concerned.

The announcement is that the new companies have nothing for sale—no stocks, no bonds, no lands. Later they may have all of these for sale, especially lands.

Articles of incorporation of the two companies were filed yesterday. The Buckhorn company is capitalized at \$500,000 in shares of \$100 each. L. A. Merrill, president; Lloyd Sigler, vice president; Joseph C. Tamm, secretary and treasurer; Olean Stohl, ad. A. B. Irvine, additional directors.

The Ariel company has a capitalization of \$100,000 in shares of \$1. The officers are D. H. Parke, president; Benjamin Rich, vice president; Samuel W. Taylor, treasurer; Samuel Y. Taylor, secretary; Lloyd Sigler and A. B. Irvine, additional directors.

These two organizations are the ones in whose names the big project will be conducted, but they are not the real interests behind the undertaking. The real interest is the property of the National Savings & Trust company, of which L. N. Stohl is president and Lloyd Sigler is manager.

The National Savings & Trust company, said Mr. Sigler last night, "bought the land from John W. Taylor for \$150,000—\$150,000 in real money. The project we have under consideration will call for the expenditure of \$700,000. It will not be a reclamation project. The land will be laid out in the form of a park by one of the most renowned landscape architects of the United States, Mr. Ames of Boston.

World's Biggest Siphon. We will get our water from the Huntington river bringing it to the reservoir by means of a siphon, the longest in the world. The siphon will be 20,000 feet in length and six feet in diameter. It is the intention to build a branch railroad to the Buckhorn. There is already a grade there—the old grade of the Rio Grande Western. This we propose to utilize to connect with the main line of the Denver & Rio Grande at Wellington."
