

GRADUATES OF HIGH SCHOOL

FIFTY-FOUR GIVEN DIPLOMAS AT COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES

Juniors Kidnap Merlin Stone, Who Effects An Escape in Time to Deliver Oration.

The seventeenth annual commencement exercises of the Ogden High school were held at the Grand Opera house, last night, and while some of the audience who attended the commencement for years past, declared that this year's exercises were somewhat tame, there were enough features to hold the appreciative and undivided interest of all.

The exercises were opened by an overture, "Reverie," by the High school orchestra, composed of girls and boys of that institution.

The next number on the program was an oration, "Physical Education," to be delivered by Mr. Merlin J. Stone, a graduate in the classical course.

The mystery of his failure to appear was explained a half hour later, when the young man arrived, slightly tumbled and nervous but still determined to fill his part of the program.

He took the center of the stage, and after a prolonged "Rah, rah, rah, Stone, Stone, Stone" from the guilty juniors, who had gathered at the rear of the playhouse, he proceeded with his address.

The graduating classes then arose and, accompanied by the school orchestra, joined in a pleasing chorus, "The Voice of the Western Wind."

The commencement address was delivered by Rev. Elmer J. Goshen, of Salt Lake City. Mr. Goshen addressed the young people to remember the Biblical adage that "A man reaps but what he sows," urged them to be honest, ambitious, and sincere during their future life, whether it be spent in a university or in the business world.
