

# VOLCANIC ERUPTION WHICH WILL BE SEEN AT THE FOUR-STATE FAIR

## Grand Pyrotechnic Display Representing Mauna Loa, on the Hawaiian Islands, in Action—Reproduction Is by a Local Artist Who Saw The Volcano During an Outburst

Our esteemed fellow citizen, Enoch Farr, Jr., has signed a contract with the Four-State Fair Association to reproduce the explosion and eruption of the famous Hawaiian volcano Mauna Loa, at the close of each evening's entertainment of the Fair.

The latest authorities, speaking of the Hawaiian island volcanoes, say: On the island of Hawaii exists the largest active volcano in the world, that of Kilauea; nearby and related to it is the famous Mauna Loa, whose beautiful and terrific eruptions are known all over the world and which cause thousands of tourists and sight-seers to visit the islands. It is the eruption of this mountain that will be imitated at the Four-State Fair.

At night the illumination was indescribably grand. In places the fiery stream spread out to miles in width and, passing over abrupt declivities, formed cascades of flaming debris, stupendous in brilliancy. Fire fountains played all along the moving mass. This eruption within the seventeen days that the flow lasted, was signalized by nearly 400 earthquake shocks, none of which did heavy damage, terrifying though they were to the few

people living near the focus of disturbance. The flow of 1299 started on the second Fourth of July after the annexation of Hawaii to the United States. Those fortunate to get within near view of the diversified manifestations, were rewarded with displays such as few human beings have ever had opportunity to enjoy. The eruption, according to guesses made by observers, appear to have started within 3,000 feet of the summit, but eruptive cones of great magnitude developed at various distances farther down for two or three miles. Some of these focuses were mighty fountains, throwing not only fused material but huge boulders to a height of fifty feet. At the highest vent the eruption formed a crater, which assumed the form of a mound 150 feet high, over the rim of which four streams of lava poured to merge at the base into a mighty river.

### SALT LAKE AND STATE NEWS

**FATHER AND SON HAVE NARROW ESCAPE**  
Salt Lake City, Aug. 25.—Without local parallel is the strange case of E. J. Williams and his eight-year-old son, Gordon Williams of 9 Rustic Court, who were struck by lightning Sunday afternoon near Husler's flour mill on Mill creek. The lightning left perfect photographs of a nearby tree imprinted on the bodies of father and son. Both were rendered unconscious and temporarily paralyzed but are fast recovering.

The two had gone to Mill creek for an afternoon with the trout and had sought shelter under a large tree near a pile of lumber when the violent thunderstorm of Sunday passed over that region. Well sheltered from the rain, they had just completed their lunch when a blinding glare of lightning struck the street, ploughed up the ground and passed through the bodies of Williams and his son. Upon regaining consciousness Williams found himself several yards from where he had been sitting, and upon attempting to move discovered that every muscle except those of his right hand was paralyzed. Little Gordon was still nestling under his father's arm, conscious but badly hurt and also partially paralyzed. Finding his father helpless the brave little fellow crawled on his hands and knees, being unable to rise, down the creek to where two men were fishing. The men rushed to the spot and carried Williams to a nearby house, where his limbs were chafed and whisky poured down his throat. Later the ambulance from St. Mark's hospital took both the injured to their home.

**Imprints of Tree.**  
When the clothing was removed, both Williams and his son were found to have perfect imprints of a tree on their breasts, and the elder Williams was covered from head to foot with imprints of leaves and tree branches. Although confined to his bed Monday and part of yesterday, he was able to sit up yesterday afternoon and is fast regaining the use of his muscles. Strangely enough, neither of them was at all burned by the lightning. The little boy has entirely recovered from the effects of his experience.

The ground in the vicinity of where the lightning struck is ploughed up in straight line from the tree trunk to the lumber pile under which the two sat. The lumber pile was toppled over and Williams and his son narrowly escaped being crushed under the falling lumber.

**BRIGHAM HOUSECLEANING FOR ANNUAL PEACH DAY**  
Brigham City, Aug. 24.—Considerable work has been done in repairing Main street during the last few weeks, and today the work of filling and

grading the west side of Main street between Fourth and Fifth South streets was commenced. This piece of road has been torn up for a long time. The long rows of trees on Forest street are being sprayed and a general cleaning up is going on. The city will be in condition for Peach day, September 15.

**WORKMAN TO SERVE TERM FOR MURDER**  
Heber City, Aug. 24.—Gilbert Workman, charged with the murder of James Griffin at Vernal last November, today changed his plea of not guilty to guilty and was sentenced by Judge A. C. Hatch to ten years in the state penitentiary. Workman was represented by Attorney J. A. Wilson of Vernal.

The trial was held here because of the failure to secure a jury at Vernal, in Utah county. With the understanding that he would plead guilty to a charge of murder in the second degree, the judge allowed the defendant to change his plea.

During the trial it developed that Workman was suffering from a bad attack of delirium tremens, following a protracted spree, when the shooting occurred, and was really in a demented state of mind. This fact was responsible for the light sentence imposed.

Bad blood had existed between Workman and Griffin for some time prior to the killing, on account of money matters. When Griffin refused to pay Workman money said to be overdue the latter went to a bartender, borrowed a gun and walking up to where Griffin was standing shot him through the chest.

By the post cards, she says, it is evident that Hassing has not only made advances to Ogden women but he has also made many feminine friends in Salt Lake City.

The couple were married in Ogden in July, 1894 and they have four children. For the last two years the Hassings have lived apart. Mrs. Hassing asks for absolute separation and the custody of the children.

**CONTEST WILL OF SARAH KERSHAW**  
John M. Cannon, Clarence Cannon, Earl Kershaw, Lawrence Kershaw and others are contesting the last will of Mrs. Sarah Kershaw, who died in this city June 19, 1909.

It is claimed by the contestants that on April 24, 1905, Mrs. Kershaw, without undue influence or duress executed a will which revoked all other wills which she might have made. In this will she gave so much to each of her heirs and left an amount to be held in trust, from which her bodily heirs should be educated. She appointed John M. Cannon and Clarence M. Cannon to look after this trust fund, and asked that these two with Robert Lundy act as executors of her estate. It is claimed that at the time of the signing of the will she was in a perfect mental condition and under no duress, nor did anyone have any undue influence over her at that time. The will was signed by Angus M. Cannon and A. B. Irvine as witnesses.

### MAXWELL'S BODY LIES IN MORGUE

The body of "Gunplay" Maxwell, alias Clarence L. Seaman and several other names which he on different occasions assumed, lies in the morgue of Undertaker Eber W. Hall of Salt Lake City awaiting burial. When he is placed under the sod the last chapter of his eventful life will have closed.

Deputy Sheriff E. Johnston of Carbon county who shot the desperado down after the latter had drawn his revolver to shoot the officer, will probably not be prosecuted as the coroner's jury, after viewing the body and hearing the testimony of eye-witnesses to the shooting, exonerated the officer from all blame.

When the body reached Salt Lake yesterday, Mrs. Ada Maxwell, one of the dead man's widows, and his daughter created a pathetic scene as they stood beside the casket. Maxwell's other widow, with whom he was living at the time of his death, known as Mrs. C. L. Seaman, was at the Pacific hotel here when the news of his death reached her. She went to Salt Lake Tuesday morning.

The reports sent out from Salt Lake that Maxwell had pawned a quantity of jewelry at local pawnshops is without foundation, according to City Detective James Pender. Mr. Pender says that after hearing this report, he made the round of the pawnshops of Ogden but failed to find anything to substantiate the story.

During the several days spent in Ogden just prior to his departure for Price, Maxwell was frequently seen at local gambling houses where it is said he lost considerable money, but this cannot be verified.

The body will probably be buried in Salt Lake.
