REV. C. C. STRATTON GOES TO HIS REWARD

Salt Lake, April 6.—A dispatch was received in this city Tuesday evening announcing the death at Salem, Ore., of the Rev. Charles Carroll Stratton, D. D., one of the most widely known educators on the coast, and the man who built the first Methodist church in this city.

Dr. Stratton built the first little Methodist mission in this city in 1872. It was a little frame structure and occupied a site of five doors west of where the Wilson hotel now stands.
