VERY POOR WEEK ON LOCAL CHANGE

Another Chicken-Feed Day—The Prices Sagged—Smaller Ones Receiving Notice.

SALT LAKE, Sept. 24.—There was somewhat more activity in the local market this morning than on yesterday, but prices sagged woefully. It was another chicken-feed day, only the smaller securities receiving notice. The dividend on Iron Blossom has been heavily discounted, as the stock went down to 70 cents today. The market opened at 74 cents and with a fairly heavy selling market the stock began sagging, selling weak at the close. Columbus Consolidated again slipped down and was disposed of at 46 1/2 cents. Cedar Tailman sold readily around 15 and 16 1/2 cents, although there was not the usual demand for the stock. Nevada Huis held steady at \$2.42 1/2.

The total number of shares of stock were disposed of at the morning session today was 23,906, while the amount paid out by the brokers was \$5,140.

HEARING IN LUMBER CASE

On his way to California, Examiner C. F. Gerry, of the Interstate Commerce Commission, stopped off in Ogden a short time yesterday to hear the case of the Oregon Lumber Company against the Oregon Railroad & Navigation Company, the Oregon Short Line Railway company and the San Pedro, Los Angeles & Salt Lake Railway company to recover \$183,840, alleged to be due the complainant for overpayment on freight on a certain shipment of lumber from Baker city, Oregon, to Mammoth, Utah, October 23, 1907.

The facts, as presented to the commissioner, were that on the date in question the plaintiff company shipped a quantity of lumber over the railroads named in the complaint, and were charged for the same at carload rates, being charged at the rate of 60,000 pounds per car when as a matter of fact the car held only 56,000 pounds of lumber.

LEGAL SUMMONS.

IN THE MUNICIPAL COURT WITHIN AND FOR THE CITY OF OGDEN, COUNTY OF WEBER, STATE OF UTAH.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF UTAH, TWO-THIRDS OF ALL THE MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH OF THE TWO HOUSES CONCURRING THEREIN:

Section 1. That it is proposed to amend Section 7 of Article XIII of the Constitution of the State of Utah, so that the same shall read as follows:

Section 2. That the public school system shall include kindergarten schools, primary and grammar grades, high schools; an agricultural college; a university; and such other schools as the Legislature may establish.

Section 3. If adopted by the electors of the State of Utah, do hereby certify that the foregoing is a full, true and correct copy of a resolution proposing an amendment to Section 7 of Article XIII of the Constitution of the State of Utah, so the same will read as follows:

Section 4. When authorized to create indebtedness as provided in Section 3 of this article, no county shall become indebted to an amount, including existing indebtedness, exceeding two per centum, No city, town, school district or other municipal corporation, shall become indebted to an amount, including existing indebtedness, exceeding five per centum of the value of the taxable property therein, the value to be ascertained by the last assessment for State and County purposes, previous to the incurring of such indebtedness, except that in incorporated cities the last assessment for city purposes, provided, that no part of the indebtedness allowed in this section shall be incurred for other than strictly county, city, town or school district purposes; provided, further, that any city, town or school district, when authorized as provided in Section 3 of this article, may be allowed to incur a larger indebtedness, not to exceed four per centum and any city, town or school district, when authorized as provided in Section 3 of this article, may be allowed to incur a larger indebtedness, not to exceed eight per centum additional, for supplying such city or town with water, artificial lights or sewers, when the works for supplying such water, light and sewers, shall be owned and controlled by the municipality.

Section 5. If approved by the electors of the State this proposed amendment to be published as required by the Constitution and to be submitted to the electors of the State at the next general election in the manner provided by law.

Section 6. If approved by the electors of the State this proposed amendment shall take effect on the first day of January, 1911.

LEGAL (Continued)

State of the State of Utah, do hereby certify that the foregoing is a full, true and correct copy of a resolution proposing an amendment to Section 4 of Article XIV of the Constitution of the State of Utah, so the same will read as follows:

Section 1. To meet casual deficits or failures in revenue, and for necessary expenditures for public purposes, including the erection of public buildings, and for the payment of all Territorial indebtedness assumed by the State, the State may contract debts, as shown by last assessment for State purposes, previous to the incurring of such indebtedness. But the State shall never contract any indebtedness, except as in the next Section provided, for the purpose of raising and amounting to the sum of \$1,000,000, and the same shall be applied solely to the purposes for which they were authorized.

Section 2. The public school system shall include kindergarten schools, primary and grammar grades, high schools; an agricultural college; a university; and such other schools as the Legislature may establish.

Section 3. If adopted by the electors of the State of Utah, do hereby certify that the foregoing is a full, true and correct copy of a resolution proposing an amendment to Section 2 of Article X of the Constitution of the State of Utah, so the same will read as follows:

Section 4. The Secretary of State is directed to submit this proposed amendment to the electors of the State at the next general election, in the manner provided by law.

Section 5. If approved by the electors of the State, this proposed amendment shall take effect on the first day of January, 1911.
