It will move into the building formerly occupied by the Mt. State Gas Company. The building has been moved to the Latstetter property on Pike street, opposite the postoffice. The building which has been vacated has been sold to Charles A. Short. He will begin moving it as soon as it is vacated. Ed Rone will also vacate his present quarters Monday and move to the new building alongside the Manhattan Cafe. He has a handsomely constructed room. It is quite commodious and will give him a better opportunity to branch out in the profitable business he has built up by his energy and enterprise.
