"ON TO CAIRO."

The advantages to be derived from the establishment of a nine foot water channel in the Ohio river from Pittsburg to Cairo, are innumerable and it is to be hoped that the delegation at Washington representing the Ohio Valley Improvement Association, will be successful in securing national legislation in its behalf. The representatives of the improvement association ask for three million dollars to begin the work of locking and damming the Ohio river so that a nine foot stage will be possible throughout the entire year. There is not an inland water way in this whole country whose improvement would benefit such a large territory, so many industries and so great a number of people, as the Ohio river. It will take millions of dollars to complete the work outlined, but as a comparatively small appropriation is asked for each year it would seem the wisest and most prudent expediency for the growth, development, progress and advancement of the nation itself to start this great work at once.

A NUISANCE.

It is extremely annoying and embarrassing for women to almost fight their way through a crowd of hooligans to get to the main entrance of the opera house in this city. SUGGESTIONS FOR CLARKSBURG MERCHANTS

Midwinter Dullness.


