Of Wesley Rosier, Occurs at His Home at Bristol, After Lingering Illness—Funeral Tuesday.

The age of the deceased was about 62 years. He is survived by two sons and one daughter. The sons are Dr. John Rosier, of Cameron, and Prof. Joseph Rosier, superintendent of the Fairmont city schools. The daughter is Miss Florence Rosier at home. His wife died several years ago.

The funeral will be held at 1 o'clock Tuesday afternoon and the interment will be in the Law cemetery, on Cherry Camp Run, near Bristol.
