Permit to erect a two-story frame blacksmith shop on Elk street, between Main and Pike streets was granted to A. A. Riblett.

E. E. Brewer was given permission of the council to erect a one-story frame house on Coal street.

A bill of \$13 as witness fees for two witnesses in the case of Carrie W. McViears vs. the City of Clarksburg, submitted by Attorney H. F. Smith, was referred to the city attorney for adjustment.

The street committee was given power to act upon an alleged nuisance on Popular street, caused by water drained from Pinnickintuck hill over the Baltimore & Ohio railroad tracks running on the street, making it almost impassable. Council then adjourned.
