SMALL POX SCARE

Doctors J. E. Robins, of Clairmont; S. W. Varner, of Glenville, and A. R. Warden, of Grafton, members of the State Board of Health and Dr. Charles W. Hallerman, of this city, who is assisting in the examination being held by the board, left Wednesday afternoon for Mount Clare where they will investigate the alleged prevalence of small pox in that vicinity. There have been several cases of something like small pox in the neighborhood of Mount Clare and they have caused a regular small pox scare. It is believed the disease prevalent there is but chicken pox or some light skin disease.
