## CREMATORY

Rules and Regulations As Provided in New City Ordinance, Will Go Into Effect Next Monday—Schedule of Rates to Be Charged.

The rules and regulations for the management of the city garbage crematory as provided for in the new ordinance recently passed by the city council, will go into effect next Monday morning. Upon that date and thereafter the following shall be the schedule of rates to be charged and collected by the city for burning refuse, etc., in the cremators.

- 2 horse load of refuse.....\$ .40
- 1 horse load of refuse.....\$ .20
- 2 horse load of excelsior, infected goods, etc.....\$ .30
- 1 horse load of excelsior, infected goods, etc.....\$ .15
- 1 barrel night soil.....\$ .20
- 1 barrel garbage and refuse.....\$ .05
- 1 horse, mule or cow.....\$ 1.50
- 1 calf or hog.....\$ .50
- 1 sheep or goat.....\$ .15
- 1 dog or cat.....\$ .10

The ordinance regarding the regulation of the crematory has been printed as required and any person may obtain a copy by applying to City Clerk W. H. Cole at the city building. The penalty for violating any section of the ordinance is a fine of from \$1.00 to \$20.00 and jail imprisonment from one to thirty days.
