### FOREIGNERS

In the Haymond Grove and Police Go to the Scene—Brack Hooker Wanted to Do John Hull But Fled From Officers.

The foreign laborers residing in Haymond's grove, on Sycamore street, had a big row at 8.00 o'clock Friday night among themselves and it reached the stage where it was deemed essential to summon the police. Police-man White, Simms and Fox responded but when they arrived on the scene they found the foreigners all laughing and saying, "Me no fight."

But Brack Hooker had it in for John Hull for some reason and what he was going to do to him was a plenty, until he saw the officers coming. Then he fled and finally took refuge in a shanty. They lost sight of him and returned to their beats without having bagged any game.

The idea is that the foreigners had been drinking rather freely and that John Barleycorn set them at odds toward one another for the time being. Something of the sort was accountable for the row, as they are accustomed to dwell together in peace.

In police court Saturday morning at the regular session Hooper was fined three dollars and costs for disorderly conduct and in default he went to jail for three days.
