TRUE AS GOSPEL.

There is nothing truer than the declaration in the Republican national platform that Democratic tariff has always brought business adversity and Republican tariff business prosperity. It is not necessary to go back many years to illustrate this. All remember what a batch of the tariff question a Democratic Congress with Wilson and Gorman at the head and Grover Cleveland as the guiding star made of it and what business stagnation followed, even to the marching of thousands of men across the continent to the seat of government to demand relief. All remember the numerous soup houses that were established in various parts of the land to give the people temporary relief and to keep the nation from starving. All recall the terrible business stagnation and the sufferings of the people, who according to present Democratic pretense, were made equal and free. All remember the miserable failure of the Democratic administration, yet it went in on the pretense of revising the tariff holding forth the idea that the people of the nation would be more prosperous and happier by its operation. The people of the nation also recall how conditions changed for the better when McKinley was elected and a Republican tariff supplanted the Democratic makeshift. We all bring to mind the march of progress that then began and which has so splendidly kept up. Even the school boy can appreciate the great strides we have made as a nation. Every point and period in our history tells him that the Republican party and its tariff are what have been followed by business prosperity and national happiness. And he is convinced like all that it is true that "Democratic tariff is followed by business adversity, and Republican tariff is followed by business prosperity." This being so, a thoughtful people also feel that the tariff question is safe only in the hands of the Republican party, it having shown its ability to handle that matter for the best interests of the country, and being safe only in its hands is not safe in Democratic hands.

### TRUST BOMB EXPLODED.

Ex-Secretary of War Elihu Root in his Chicago convention speech showed the Democrats what they had failed to do with the trusts and what the Republican administration had done. Among other things, fourteen railroads of this country have been restrained from giving illegal rebates to shippers. The beef trust has been enjoined. The officers of the railroads in the great cotton pool have been indicted and as the result have abandoned their combination, the Great Northern Securities Company, which undertook to put under one ownership two great railroads in the North west and thus break up competition, has been destroyed. All this has happened under the present Republican administration, and yet the last Democratic president said it could not be done. This question, like all others of moment, could not be successfully handled by the Democratic party, and it took a party in keeping with the times and which is a party of national politics, as "Uncle Joe" Cannon says, to do it. That party has not done it in the sentimental way, but has pursued business methods and invoked the law for the purpose. Mr. Root has made plain the fact that the insincerity of the Democratic cry against the Republican party, and the course of the administration renders that cry ineffective and inoperative in the present campaign.

It is a fact that the Democratic party will meet in national convention with ideas so at variance with one another that no one knows now what the convention will bring forth. All the past decade there has been a flapping about for policies and men. They seem to have a weakness in this respect and what is called Democratic doctrine this year is called something else next year. The day has not been far distant when free silver was the fundamental plank of the Democratic platform, and yet today there is a disposition not to regard it so. Only a few years ago free trade was their hobby, and yet today such an eminent Democratic authority as Senator Vest from Missouri, who is a leader in the councils of the Democratic party, says free trade is a dead issue. These are but samples of their unsteadiness of purpose. Thus it is seen how unstable and unsafe that party is.

When Knox was attorney general the administration was accused of standing in with the trusts, but just as soon as he leaves the cabinet the Democratic howl goes up that the trusts forced him out of the administration, because he had prosecuted them. It is another of those inconsistencies characteristic of the Democratic party, which has no staid purpose, but gathers men together on occasions and formulates different ideas from those they had one previous time they met.

There is considerable anxiety among a number of Democrats to know more about the slate the Democratic clique has fixed up. Additional inquiries are being made by these Democrats of the Telegram, and we assure them that we think we will be in a position in a few days to tell them more. The iron-clad oath racket, however, may delay us some, but that oath will not likely amount to much, as there are men who are above such things.
