SODA FOUNTAINS TO BE OVERHAULED BY STATE FOOD COMMISSION.

Soda fountains of the insanitary kind are likely to be overhauled by the State Food Commission. The legislature will be asked to clothe the Commissioner with authority to condemn all fountains not possessing sanitary syrup receptacles and other parts hidden from the public gaze.

It is the decided opinion of many druggists and other soda fountain operators that the ice chamber should be entirely separated from syrups, which should be stored "IN GLASS BOTTLES IN PLAIN VIEW OF CUSTOMERS."
