'SODA FOUNTAINS TO BE OVERHAULED BY STATE FOOD COMMISSION.'

Soda fountains of the insani-tary kind are likely to be over-hauled by the State Food Commission. The legislature will be asked to clothe the Commissioner with authority to condemn all fountains not possessing sanitary syrup receptacles and other parts hidden from the public gaze.

It is the decided opinion of many druggists and other soda fountain operators that the ice chamber should be entirely separated from syrups, which should be stored "IN GLASS BOT-TLES IN PLAIN VIEW OF CUSTOMER."
