M SMITH ENDORSES YOSTS BOOK

Some days ago your Mr. Morrison asked me, in conjunction with Mr. E. D. Lewis, to write a short criticism on the Book of Football recently gotten out by Mr. F. H. Yost.

So far as the technicalities of the game are concerned, I do not feel competent to argue with so eminent an authority as Mr. Yost. Am perfectly willing to take his statements as true, and judging by the success he has had upon the gridiron, I know of no authority before the football world today who has any license whatever to gainsay them. But, as I understand it, the purpose of the book is to acquaint the general public with the fundamental principles of the game, so that some understanding of the seemingly rough and tumble fight can be had. In other words, football has never been a popular game with the masses as has baseball, simply because the average spectator cannot make head or tail of it. Yost's book endeavors to simplify and explain all this. I start out to make it so simple that anybody can understand a game of football, even though they never saw one before. And more than any other book on the subject has the object been accomplished.

The style, characteristic of the man, is enthusiastic, accurate and complete! The photographs are especially attractive, both because they completely illustrate the author's ideas, and because they are taken from some of the greatest players the game has known.

The book is handsomely bound, and printed on attractive paper. A school boy just learning to kick the "pig skin" can hardly afford to be without a copy, and no coach in the country is so wise but that he can learn lots from its covers. As an old football player I heartily endorse it.


