BLIZZARD AND ELKINS.

After all that has been said and done, the Telegram ventures the assertion that no man in the state stands closer politically to Senator Stephen B. Elkins than does Judge Reese Blizzard, and yet there are some who class him as an "insurgent." If Blizzard is such, Elkins is in the same class, and as all those who are rindly abusing these terms, insurgents, are for Elkins, it does appear they are not wise to the situation. Judge Blizzard has ever been a friend of Senator Elkins. No man who knows the situation can believe that the Judge ever entertained the notion of trying to defeat him for re-election. Why should he? They are too close together for that.

Then, in this connection it is certainly ridiculous for even some Republican papers to persist in classifying Judge Blizzard with what they call "insurgents." Latest of all is the expression of the Charleston Mail on the subject, when it undertakes to set forth the proposition that Judge Blizzard has become too much of a boss among the so-called "insurgents." It is too ridiculous even to talk about. The Mail may rest assured that if the "insurgents" are to be measured by Judge Blizzard's gauge there are none such, but that good, loyal Republicans have been mis-judged, because of some slight difference on the tax question.

Again, the Mail imputes to Judge Blizzard that he is one of the tax dodgers. Now, is it not a fact that the Judge was one of the four fathers of the present laws? Did not the great Republican convention at Wheeling also unanimously adopt a plank in the platform, approved by Senator Elkins and in fact partly made by him, upon which the present tax laws were based? Judge Blizzard, Senator Elkins, Governor Dawson and all other Republicans stand on an equal footing in this respect, and it is certainly unfair to single out Judge Blizzard from among them all and apply epithets to him.

And, after all, no man will give Senator Elkins heartier support for re-election than will Judge Blizzard. This is not so much a prediction as it is an expression of actual knowledge of Judge Blizzard's intentions and desires, though not stated as coming personally from him but through those closely associated with him.

All have good reason to believe that within a few years at most it will be one of the most extensive employment furnishing industries the city will have, and a great factor in the city's trade.

It is, indeed, a great pleasure and gratification to the Telegram to be able to announce the coming of this splendid industry.

It is gratifying to see the street car line branching out in every direction that brings any advantage at all to the city. It may be there are some who find objections to this, but they must acknowledge that a network of street car lines in this community will prove of great advantage both to the city and county. What man is there in Clarksburg who regrets the coming of the street car to this city? What man at Wheeling regrets the fact that a line is in operation from that town? Who is it that is sorry the line runs to Grasselli? Who is it that disapproves of the line to the new fair grounds? Who objects to the proposed line to the tin plate mills? Who believes that the line between Clarksburg and Fairmont will not be a good thing for Harrison and Marion counties? And is there really any one who thinks that a line up the Millford road and out beyond O'Neil toward Salem would not be a benefit to the communities they would go through. And is there any one who would not like to see Clarksburg and Bridgeport connected by trolley? Prejudice should not allow one to retard the advancement of his own section. If a street car line will help, welcome it rather than throw barriers in its way.

And the latest turn of the tax dodgers is their cry to wait until they see their tax tickets. On top of that they say there is no proof. At last they are coming to the Republican side. The tax tickets will certainly show for themselves and the Republican party is standing by those tickets. They made them and are responsible for them. Best of all they have no fear. Wonder if the dodgers will be willing to stand by those tickets, when they see them lower than they have ever been? We opine they will try to trump up something shady to make the people believe that they have been humbugged even by lower taxation.

Since Democratic papers concede that there is no proof on the tax reform question, because of the fact that the tax tickets as they call them, really tax receipts, have not yet been issued, why should they waste their breath with representations about them until after they are issued? Why denounce them without foundation, since you admit that the only way to know is to wait and see what they are?

The Telegram joins with the Methodists in extending their new presiding elder a hearty welcome, and expresses highest appreciation of the services rendered by Dr. D. L. Ash during his long eldership in this district. It voices its most earnest desire for unlimited success by both the retiring presiding elder and his successor. On Rock Camp run, Sardis district, this county the South Penn Oil Co.'s test on the J. W. Edgell farm is something of a disappointment. It was drilled through the Gordon and then given a shot and produced 18 barrels the ensuing 24 hours. Judge Nathan Goff's No. 40, located 1,000 feet to the southwest is holding up at 90 barrels a day.

In the Salem district, the South Penn Oil Co.'s No. 2, on the Lloyd Randolph farm is holding up at 130 barrels a day and is now the best producer in the lower southwest fields. In the same district, the same company has completed No. 5 on the Andrew Spindle farm and has a 3 barrel pumper. No. 2 on the S. D. Williams farm is not good for more than 8 barrels a day.


Taken to Asylum
