**FRAUDULENT SALES
MADE OF THE STORE**

The contest over a store at Shinnston between Frank Barrilli and the Leatherbury Shoe Company and other creditors was decided by Justice Gordon in favor of the latter Friday morning. Frank claims he made an outright purchase of the store and that the deal was on the square, but the evidence seemed to show differently.
