W. V. N. G. BRIGADE HEADQUARTERS MOVED HERE

According to general order, No. 18, brigade headquarters of the West Virginia National Guard, will be moved from Charleston to Clarksburg tomorrow.

All communications with reference to the drill, discipline, or administration of organizations in the command and intended for action by authority superior to regimental commanders, will be addressed to the Assistant Adjutant General, 1st Brigade, W. V. N. G., Clarksburg, W. Va.

General orders, No. 15:
The following is published for the information and guidance of all concerned:

1. By direction of the Secretary of War, the following is published for the information of all concerned: An enlistment in the army does not operate as a discharge from the organized militia, or National Guard and a member of the National Guard, in his State who enlists in the regular army repudiates his engagement in said State troops and by so doing becomes and remains liable to such penalties as may be authorized by the laws of the State in whose military service he has been enlisted. Men who present themselves for enlistment in the army will be interrogated as to service in the National Guard, and in the event that they have served in such State troops they will be required to present satisfactory evidence that they have been honorably discharged therefrom, or if unable to do so, enlistment will be refused.

CONVENTION DATE MAY BE CHANGED

The date of the meeting of the State Christian Endeavor convention is likely to be changed.

Unless the change is made the convention will be held in Wheeling in July, but President George W. Pollock, of Buckhannon, has asked for a change of date to one of the fall months on account of the officers of the United Societies being at Geneva, Switzerland, in July attending the world's convention.

The executive board has taken the matter up and arrangements may be agreed upon, by which the date can be changed.
