INTERRUPTS SUICIDE.

Clumsy Stranger in New York Steps on Despondent's Corn.

AFFRONT QUICKLY AVENGED.

Bottle of Acid Which Was to Have Ended James Martin's Life Spoils Peter Branch's Beauty—Thrower Goes to Jail Instead of Cemetery.

James Martin, a bloodless chap of twenty-six, who never has seen much attraction in living, was sitting on the stoop of the Engineers' club, 30 West Fourth street, New York city, with a bottle of poison in his hand. Martin was all keyed up to end his life, and the bottle was uncorked for business when Peter Branch, hailing from Bridgeport, Conn., and visiting friends in New York, came along. Martin's feet were sticking far out on the pavement and accidentally

Branch planted his New England heel on Martin's pet corn. Instantly all thoughts of self destruction left Martin's mind. He wanted to destroy Branch, and as he bowed with pain he let drive the bottle of hydrochloric acid. The acid covered Branch's face and he fell with a scream of pain. Martin darted up Fifth avenue, followed by half a dozen members of the Engineers' club. Martin was quite a sprinter, and not until he had turned into Forty-second street was he overtaken. Then Policeman Moran took him to the West Thirtieth street police station and the clubmen went back to help poor Branch.

Branch was led to the office of Dr. John W. Joyce, 112 West Thirty-ninth street, and quick remedies undoubtedly saved his sight. He later went to the station house to prefer a charge against Martin.

"I meant to kill myself," began Martin, "but this guy came along and hurt my corn. I got this poison to end a miserable existence, and it would have been all over with me now if this blood-sucker hadn't interfered with me. Don't see why grown men can't walk straight anyhow. No wonder a fellow gets down-trodden."

Martin said he was a tinsmith. He said any address would do for him. He was locked up charged with felonious assault.
