Practical Morality for Hunters.

"Two worthy exhibits of genuine Americanism are (1) not to add to forest destruction by carelessly leaving fire around; and (2) always to plant a new tree—young tree—for every one you destroy. And plant it where it will do the most good," says Casper Whitney in the *Outing Magazine* for October. In setting forth some practical morality for campers and hunters.

"Be sure to put out your camp fire before you abandon it in the morning to take up the train," says Mr. Whitney. "Do not leave the task for one of your camp servants, not even for your guide whose interest in keeping the woods free of devastating fires being a matter of bread and butter, is therefore the keenest of any of your camp followers, but who, none the less, is apt to be careless. See to it yourself; leave no smoldering back-log of the night's 'friendly fire'; leave no smoking coals that have served to broil (so deliciously) the breakfast trout—for such relics so often are fanned into the tiny flame which, feeding upon near-by leaves, or moss or bush twigs, grows within two days to a devouring blaze that consumes acres of forest before its withering touch is stayed. If you are close to a brook use its water plentifully, and if water is scarce knock the live ends of the larger sticks until not a spark is left; and scrape dirt all over the coals—not a few handfuls of dust that the wind may scatter at its first breath—but dirt that will bury and smother."

"No doubt my average reader thinks I am writing a lot to deliver one small message, but let him consider that hundreds of acres of forest land worth thousands, measured by dollars, and of incalculable value reckoned as among the industrial resources of the country, are annually destroyed from just such insignificant beginnings as the camp fire which was not put out beyond the power of the passing breeze to reconstitute. Therefore the warning appeal cannot be too much emphasized; nor is the message made too important since we as a nation are using up from three to four times as much wood every year as the country is producing."

Mr. Whitney's remarks are indeed worthy of observation by all hunters and campers and if followed out by the many who go into the woods and fields, it will be the means of saving possibly thousands of dollars worth of valuable timber in many instances. Local hunters who are going out for game in the wooded sections of West Virginia, now that the same season is opened, should heed these important admonitions.

Perhaps this is the affliction that has evidently seized one or two persons in this neighborhood who have been so busily engaged for the last five or six months in trying to figure out an increase of the city debt. What they need, when they arrive at this stage, is a protracted rest and quietude.

Frequent communications to the association have resulted in attaching the blame to the Western Union, but this is the first time an intention to investigate has been heard of in this section. We hope the investigation will have results.






