presiding. Announcement was made by the board that reciprocal agreements had been made with the pharmaceutical boards of seven states and the District of Columbia in regard to certificates. Pharmacists holding certificates from any of those state boards may practice pharmacy in this state without taking the examination and West Virginia certificates are likewise recognized in those states. The states are Maryland, Virginia, Ohio, Indiana, Texas, Oklahoma and Arkansas. The board will endeavor to make similar arrangements with boards of other states where the requirements appear to be equal to the standard adhered to in this state.
