WAGE REDUCTION FOR GLASS MAKING

For the Last Month is Shown by Report of the Commissioners.

Following is the official report of the window glass commissioners adopted at Columbus:

The undersigned commissioners, representing the National Window Glass Workers, and the manufacturers who are parties to the wage scale of said organization, having duly met at the Chittenden Hotel, Columbus, O., and figured the said reports from the various factories, do find as follows:

The average selling price of glass from the ten factories chosen by the commissioners for single strength glass is 90 and 31 3-4; for double strength glass, 90 and 36 1-2. This figure a reduction of wages on single strength glass of 30 1-2 per cent and a reduction of wages on double strength glass of 40 per cent.
