SATURDAY, JANUARY 10, 1909, at 1 o'clock p. m. of the year 1909, of which the said Benjamin W. Harbert died seized and possessed, consisting of the following tract or parcels:

First—A tract or parcel of land located on the waters of Robinson's Run, containing 140.93 acres, more or less, and being known as the home farm of the said Benjamin W. Harbert, deceased. The Harbert or nine foot seam of coal underlying the greater part of said land has heretofore been sold, and conveyed together with certain mining rights and privileges, and said land will be sold subject to said conveyance. In this deed the coal underlying three parcels, one containing 26 3-4 acres, one 25 square poles, and one containing 2 acres, is reserved, and these reservations are set out by metes and bounds, but only a part of said reservations contain the Pittsburg coal.
