CIRCUIT COURT

Orders in Various Cases Are Entered and Suit is on Trial.

In circuit court Friday demurrer was sustained in the case of Henry M. Schutte against Edna Cottrill et al and the case was remanded to rules for an amended bill.

Demurrer was overruled in the case of Fabius E. Hall et al against the Philadelphia Company of West Virginia and the defendant company was given until October 7 to answer.

Similar orders were entered in the suits of George W. Southern et al against the South Penn OH Company and the Crude Oil Company against A. B. Comindaffer.

Plea of non-assumpsit was made in the case of Adolphus Rightmire et al against the Short Line Railroad Company.

The suggestion proceedings of G. W. and H. M. Shuttleworth, executors of the estate of the late Benjamin F. Shuttleworth, against Etta McKeenan, executrix, were dismissed.

The suit of the Smith Granite Company against E. W. Wells was on trial.

BALTIMORE BACK

To Seventh Place in United State in Point of Population.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 13—Baltimore, which was the sixth city in the United States in point of population in 1900 is now seventh according to census statistics, having in the last ten years been outstripped by Cleveland, which takes sixth place. Baltimore's population now is 556,456 compared with 508,957 in 1900.

OUT UNDER BONDS

Is Orville Dodd, Who Resisted Constables at the Fair Grounds.

Orville Dodd, who engaged in the free-for-all fight between constables and others Wednesday afternoon at the "old fair" grounds, has been released from jail under two bonds of \$500 each for his appearance in Justice Gordon's court the first of next week. 
