COUNCIL

Will Make An Investigation of the Street Paving Here.

The city council is displeased with the work of the Concrete Construction Company here and at its Friday night meeting a committee was appointed to investigate the situation and report at a special meeting of the city council Monday night. It appears that the company, which has a large city paving contract, is not completing the work as provided in the contract and that much inconvenience has resulted from torn up streets and unfinished work. The investigating committee is composed of Councilmen Thompson, Robbins and McReynolds.

Another matter of discussion at the session was the question of revoking the saloon license of Charles McBride on the ground that his saloon is improperly conducted and also on the further ground that it is in the hands of irresponsible persons.

Harvey F. Smith's petition for a sidewalk was referred to the street committee.

The street committee was also given the petition of A. C. Moore for a pavement.

Hereafter all applications for building permits must be in the hands of the chairman of the building committee so that he may examine them before the council acts on them.

A draft was ordered drawn on the state auditor for the amount of taxes on a certain lot returned delinquent in the name of Roy Alexander and others, it appearing that the city owns the lot.

A brick crossing on Mulberry street was ordered laid.

Under direction of the mayor telephones are to be placed in the different wards of the city by the chief of police. It is stated that at least two telephones will be placed in every ward.

Where improvements have been made in Glen Elk, the street superintendent by order of the council will repair the sidewalks.

Dr. D. C. Louchery appearing and asking for permission to improve his property on West Main street, he was directed to submit his plans to the chairman of the building committee.

The Fairmont and Clarksburg Amusement Company was granted bowling alley license.

As a license court the council transferred the saloon license of Kearns and Koehler to Kearns and Mount.

George A. Murray's saloon license was transferred to Frank Leap and that of R. A. Davis to R. B. and J. S. Howard.

GOOD GASSER

Is Drilled on the Holden Farm in the Mt. Clare Gas Field.

MT. CLARE, Dec. 3.—The well that was being drilled by Mr. McAlmott, contractor for the Hope Gas Company, on the farm of the Holden heirs, and whose progress was impeded by so many breakdowns and other mishaps during its long operation, came in a good gasser Friday evening.

The inclement weather of this week has been a severe handicap in getting material on the ground and rig building at the new locations.
