## LEAGUE MAN

Contracts to Steer the Baseball Team at Wesleyan Next Year.

BUCKHANNON, Dec. 19.—Manager Robert L. Smith of the Wesleyan College baseball team today received the signed contract of "Bobbie" Rothermel, late of the Grafton, W. Va., league team, to coach the Wesleyan College team during the season of 1911. Rothermel is one of the best known ball players in this section and is a veteran ball player of wide experience, having played on the old Baltimore Orioles with McGraw of the New York Giants, and with other big leaguers. He has been in the best minor leagues of this section for several years, playing in the old P. O. M., later with the Penn-W. Va. and for the last two years in the West Virginia league. He is to report for duty at Wesleyan College March 15, and is expected to give the college much the best ball team in its history.

Manager Smith reports the Wesleyan College schedule only partially finished but expects to announce the complete schedule early in the new year. The 1911 schedule will be the hardest list of baseball games Wesleyan has attempted, comprising many of the best college teams not only in West Virginia but also in Ohio and Pennsylvania. The record made last year boosted considerably Wesleyan's stock in baseball circles and if "Bobbie" Rothermel is the coach his reputation makes him look and has the material expected, his team will make a strong bid for the inter-collegiate title in West Virginia.

## PAY BEFORE CHRISTMAS.




