
SOCIALIST MEETING

McCurdy Flies Around Ancient Morro Castle Guarding Havana



MORRO CASTLE, that tremendous pile of stone and mortar that guards the harbor of Havana, was inspected from a point of view that was entirely new when J. A. D. McCurdy flew high above the fortress in an airplane a few days ago. The Havana waterfront and the flat roofed houses of the city were thronged with citizens and visitors, who watched the flight and cheered the aviator, though he was so high that he never heard the shouts, though he could see the handkerchiefs waved at him. McCurdy started his flight from Camp Columbia, where the American soldiers were quartered during the American intervention. The start was several miles from Morro castle, and by the time the aviator had reached Havana he was at a height of more than 1,000 feet and was distinctly visible to the entire city. He flew along the water front, crossed the entrance to the harbor and twice circled around the lighthouse that is the first object to greet the eyes of sailors approaching Havana. In circling the old fort McCurdy whirled almost directly over the wreck of the battleship Maine, around which a coffin-dam is being built so that it can be raised. McCurdy, who falled by ten miles to fly from Key West to Havana and thus lost the prize of \$5,000 offered for the flight, received that prize for the flight around Morro castle.

YOUTH IS THE GATE TO TEMPLE OF LIFE

Says Dr. Cartwright, and Also Says He Does Not Believe in Flying Machines

Dr. Charles L. E. Cartwright, of Pittsburg, lectured at the First Methodist Episcopal church Monday night on the subject, "You and Yours." Dr. Cartwright had a manner all his own that amuses and holds the attention of his audience while his remarks range from humorous to intensely serious and from the most innocent of pleasantries to the deepest truths. Meanwhile he punctuated and emphasizes and illustrates his talk with his inimitable gestures until his hearers are one minute laughing heartily and the next are unconsciously nodding assent to his more serious opinions and convictions.

Youth, he called "the beautiful gate to the temple of life." "Our finest ideals," he said "are filled with the breath of youth." From youth comes strength, enthusiasm, hope, purity and love. All these are youthful attributes.

"God's most glorious gift to you is yourself, and youth is the most important property he has given you."

"Man is a maker, a creator. Making or creating is the most important work of his life, and his most important creation is the making of himself."

"At the very first dawn of creation we find men pondering over the self-same questions that perplex him today. He was asking then and now, 'What is the soul? Where does it come from? What is it for?' These are the questions that agitate him to his depths today. Nothing is more remarkable in history than the practical unanimity of the newers to make to these questions.

"The world exists for the expression of spirit, the divine Spirit, and it also exists for the development of spirit, the human spirit, the soul. But the first business with you is the growing of your own soul, and then comes the second, the growing of the world's soul. Your first business is with yourself."

"All you see is subordinate to you. All the earth is under the objection of man, yes, and all the heavens, but I do not believe the heavens are to be subjected to man in some disastrous flying machine."

He paid a tribute to the love of mother and child, saying that the child can learn to love God through the mother, since it is the love of God in the mother's heart that causes her to love the child and in a similar way the child's love returns to God through the mother's heart.

A child causes a new awakening of the Godlike in us. "Since the baby came," a young mother had told him, "I have understood Christ better."

In concluding, he related a story of how a man had opened up springs in a high hill and let the water flow down into the valley, causing the ground to put forth luxuriant grass and fragrant flowers and beautiful trees, forming a little park, to which the birds were induced to come and build their nests and make the echoes ring with their sweet music. Then the owner of the land had gone away, leaving the park in the charge of a practical man, who conceived the idea that the opening of the springs was a mere waste of water, and therefore shut off the supply of moisture from the valley, with the result that the flowers withered and the vegetation perished and the birds went away and the place became a desert as before.

"So it is," Dr. Cartwright went on, "with our lives. If we cut off the influence of the beautiful in our lives, if we carry ourselves as the practical people of life, we bury ourselves with the things that are unworthy of us. Our lives are dead while we are raveling a wearisome journey from the cradle to the tomb."
