

## VETERAN

Is Edward I. Allen in the Postal Service of the Country.

WESTON, May 24—Inspector Edward I. Allen, of Parkersburg, was here last week looking up some postal irregularities. Mr. Allen has been twenty years in postal work, and though not old in years, is quite a veteran in the service, as well as a cyclopedia of postal information. He formerly had charge of the work of the department in the lower half of the state, but now has fifteen counties in the northern section, Lewis being one of the southern border counties of his field. This recalled with what vigor he followed up a chain of evidence in the early history of Richwood, in what was known as the voley case, until he landed his man in the penitentiary. That case cost the government \$10,000, but it restrained and punished an evil-doer, and has doubtless served as a healthy deterrent in many another case, showing the immediate and the ultimate value of a public official with a record for ferreting out offenders, developing the evidence, making possible the conviction of the guilty and reducing that character of crime to the minimum.
