By Collier, Director General, on His Coming Trip Through the South.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 25.—Col. D. C. Collier, director general of the Panama-California Exposition, to be held in 1915, in San Diego, California, is planning a trip through the southeastern states, to be taken immediately after the passage of the resolution now before Congress giving Federal recognition to the San Diego exposition.

This trip will be in the interest of the movement inaugurated by Director General Collier, in connection with Managing Director G. G. Dawe, of the Southern Commercial Congress, which movement has for its object the diversion of transcontinental travel from the northern routes to those that traverse the southern states.

A conference has been called by the Progressive Union, of New Orleans, to be held at some date in August of this year, when delegates from all of the commercial and civic bodies and the cities of the South will meet and confer with representatives of all of the railroads that traverse the southern states, with the purpose in view of securing from the railroads stopover privileges and other concessions that will aid in inducing travelers to go by southern rather than northern routes.

It is to stimulate interest in this movement and to induce commercial and other bodies to send representatives to the New Orleans conference that Director General Collier will undertake to visit all of the principle cities of the South, and to make numerous addresses before the commercial bodies. The itinerary of his trip will be made public later.
