

## ITALIAN

Celebration in the City of Fairmont Will Be Big Unique Affair.

Fairmont, June 3.—The Italians of this section are preparing for a great celebration which will take place when the "Feast of St. Anthony" will be celebrated at the St. Joseph Italian church in this city. The program will open at 7 o'clock in the morning and will continue during the entire day, closing at 8 o'clock in the evening with what is expected to be the greatest pyrotechnic display ever witnessed in this part of the state when the Fazzoni Brothers Co., of New Castle, Pa., will give a fireworks exhibition.

The committee in charge of the affair is covering the town and county with posters announcing the celebration, which will be attended by hundreds of Italians from all parts of the county and state. The official program is announced as follows:

7:00 a. m.—Greeting to Fairmont with artificial day fireworks.

7:30 a. m.—Blessing of Statue of St. Anthony, the gift of Mrs. and Mr. Feorene.

8:00 a. m.—Mass, celebrated by Father Scheenen, the pastor of the church of Fairmont.

9:00 a. m.—March through the city by the excellent music band of Clarksborg under direction of its master and director, Mr. Sanstefano.

10:00 a. m.—Solemn high mass. Father Mortorano, of Wheeling, Father Jacobetti, of Clarksborg and other priests assisting.

11:00 a. m.—Sermon on the feast and occasion by Father Pacifico Jacobetti, of Clarksborg.

3:00 p. m.—March through the city.

4:00 p. m.—Popular Italian games and sports, mingled with Italian home customs.

4:30 p. m.—Italian fair.

7:00 p. m.—Solemn Vespers in St. Joseph's church.

7:30 p. m.—Illumination of church and neighborhood in Venetian and Japanese colors and displays.

8:00 p. m.—Great fireworks by the Fazzoni Bros. Co., of New Castle, Pa., the greatest pyrotechnic display ever witnessed in this part of the state.

### Set Pieces.

- Welcome.
- Medallion of Roosevelt.
- Search light pine wheel, 4 feet in diameter.
- Flashing pin wheel, 4 feet in diameter.
- Electric fountain, 20 feet high.
- Scroll quadrille, showing five wheels, 15 feet in diameter.
- A castle with 150 flower pots, showing comets, colored stars, etc.
- American star with American flag on top.
- American beauty rose, 8 feet across.
- Revolver wheel, can be heard a distance of four miles.
- Flying pin wheel. This wheel revolves on the ground two minutes, then flies through the air 500 feet.
- Good night. Visible for one mile.

### Shells and Bombs.

- One-fourth dozen search light shells visible for 12 miles.
- One-fourth dozen National bombs, red, white and blue.
- One-fourth dozen jeweled pine shells.
- One-fourth dozen Cascade bombs, showing a correct representation of Niagara Falls.
- One-fourth dozen colored star shells.
- One-fourth dozen four main burst shells.
- One-fourth dozen willow tree shells, a mass of brilliant fire, taking the shape of a willow tree.
- One-fourth dozen electric shower shells, throw a shower of electric jewels.
- One-fourth dozen peacock plume shells display a broad swelling spread of double gold.

- One-half dozen diamond chain shells, a beautiful stream of colors.
- One-third dozen new combination shells, each shell containing from 3 to 5 different and distinct effects.
- One-fourth dozen dragon shells, hissing snakes ending in explosions and trails of fire.
- One-fourth dozen salute shells exploding with 18 terrific reports.
- Two shells exploding in mid-air with 50 reports which can be heard for five miles.
- Three balloons with fireworks attached.

## CIRCUS

At Grafton June 23 Will Be a Great Drawing Attraction for City.

The Great Adam Forepaugh and Mills Brothers' circus will give two performances in Grafton on Friday June 23.

In New York City this show is considered the best of all American amusement institutions. For nearly fifty years it has held first place in the esteem of the public—in fact of the world, for there is not a country on earth that is civilized where at some time or another it has not pitched its many acres of tents.

The sensation with the show this year is the automobile double somersault in mid air, accomplished by a young French woman not yet out of her teens. For utter recklessness and apparent disregard of death this act stands pre-eminent. The heavy car shoots with lightning speed down a slender incline, leaps high in air and while the audience is stamping it turns two complete revolutions in space, then dropping with terrific force to a steel platform. This is the most thrilling of all the world's thrillers. Circuses in the past have exploited a tame affair billed as a double somersaulting automobile act, but when the truth is known but one and one-half revolutions were accomplished. This is the only act of genuine character that has been seen in this country. It is a French importation.

Other thrills are added by the Ty-Bell "Human Butterflies." They are three beautiful French girls, who, clinging by the teeth to slender steel wires, are drawn to the dome of the tent, where by means of hidden mechanism they are made to dive, dart and poutrette like birds while a battery of electric spot lights and calciums bathe them in fantastic colors. The act is the most sensational and at the same time the most beautiful aerial spectacle ever devised.

The parade which the show is giving this year is three miles long and absolutely new in ideas from start to finish. Over 1,000 people, 500 horses and three herds of elephants are seen in it. The entire equipment of the show is new and the menagerie is the most complete collection of rare animals in America.
