

New York's \$10,000,000 Library To House Four Million Books

NEW YORK city at last has a public library of which the entire nation should be proud. It faces on Fifth avenue and extends from Fortieth to Forty-second street. The cost of the building, including the clearing of the site of the old reservoir that had stood there for half a century, was \$10,000,000. The land occupied is estimated as worth \$3,000,000, and no money value can be placed on the literary and art treasures that will be stored in the handsome marble pile. The building has been in course of erection for eleven years, about one-half of that time being needed to complete the interior work after the roof was put on in December, 1906. The library is a consolidation of the Astor, Tilden and Lenox libraries, the consolidation being effected May 23, 1895, just sixteen years before President Taft assisted in formally opening the building to the public. The building contains ninety miles of shelves, enough to reach from New York to Philadelphia, and 4,000,000 volumes will be housed inside. The pictures above show an exterior view of the building and the interior of the main reading room.
