

Bogus Checks Being Passed

With the Name of a Former Clarksburg Woman Forged.

Some one is lying about the state who is very handy in using the name of Mrs. Emma Haley, of Grafton, but formerly of Clarksburg, who conducts the City cafe on Main street, at Grafton, and Mrs. Haley has received notification from several banks and business firms to the effect that they are holding checks signed by her.

A case of forgery has developed and to date checks have been forged on Mrs. Haley to the extent of more than \$90. These were made payable to one "Nellie Ashby" and "Virginia Dare." The first of these checks was passed at the Watson hotel in Fairmont for \$15. Henry Blumberg, of the Underselling Stores, at Grafton, has another for \$15, and notification of one made payable to "Virginia Dare," and deposited by H. E. Goodnow, at the Second National Bank of Morgantown, for \$15 has been received. Another payable to "Virginia Dare" was cashed at the Grafton Bank for \$15, and one at Wheeling was cashed for \$12.50. In addition to these there are one or two others floating around, totaling up the amount forged to something over \$90.

The authorities in Wheeling have a man and woman under arrest on suspicion of forgery, and they may be the persons who have been forging the name of Mrs. Haley.

It is possible that several other forged checks will be reported before they end, and if those passing the bogus papers are those in custody at Wheeling they will be vigorously prosecuted.

ROOM

Of Board of Trade is to Be Used for School Purposes.

SHINNSTON, Oct. 6.—For some time it has been known that it would be necessary to have an additional room for the eighth grade room of the Shinnston schools. Heretofore the seventh and eighth grades have been taught by one teacher, but the opening of this term fully demonstrated the fact that there were enough pupils for two teachers, and as the already large and well equipped building was occupied to its fullest capacity, the board of education at once commenced to secure an additional room.

The old Methodist Episcopal church was spoken of as a place that would be suitable, but it could not be secured. This was the only building empty and it looked for several days as if the much needed additional room could not be gotten, but the board of trade got together and proposed to let its room be used for this term. The school officers and the members of the board of trade met a recent night and the meeting resulted in the board of education securing the room. This necessitated the hiring of an additional teacher.

This will not hinder the board of trade in any manner in going on with its work as it only has a meeting once a month, which is at night.
