CHARTERS

Are Granted by the Secretary of State to More State Concerns.

CHARLESTON, Mar. 23—A charter has been issued to the Huntington Development and Gas Company to furnish commercial natural gas. The movement was started by the board of trade of that city securing a large farm from which to supply gas for industries about the city of Huntington. The authorized capital is \$500,000, and among the incorporators are D. E. Abbott, G. A. Northcott, Hans Watts, J. T. McClintock, W. H. Banks, T. A. Zeller, C. W. Thornburg, F. A. MacDonald, C. P. Snow and others, all of Huntington.

Other charters issued were to the Arrow Bottling Company, of 1228 Konadnock block, Chicago, Ill., to manufacture and deal in machinery for washing, soaking, rinsing, filling, etc. The authorized capital is \$50,000, and the incorporators: Albert H. Graves, Joyce M. Lutz, Samuel N. Pond, Charles J. Schmidt and Frank L. Belknap, all of Chicago.

John Friedel Company's Five and Ten Cent Stores, of Wheeling, to operate five and ten cent stores, etc. Authorized capital, \$200,000. Incorporators: G. A. Moyer, John Friedel, M. E. Friedel, Harry Friedel and C. P. Metzner, all of Wheeling.
