


PLATT ADAMS OF NEW YORK IS ONE OF AMERICA'S BEST ALL AROUND ATHLETES

# CHROMIC

## Iron Ore Importations Greater Than Country's Domestic Production.

WASHINGTON, June 20.—The production of chromic iron ore, or chromite, in the United States in 1911 amounted to 120 tons, valued at \$1,629, according to W. C. Phalen in an advance chapter from "Mineral Resources of the United States for 1911," just published by the United States Geological Survey. This figure of production represents the amount that was actually sold or entered the market. The quantity mined was considerably greater, but some of the ore mined did not enter the market owing in part to a somewhat curtailed demand and in part to the difficulty of transporting it. The ore sold came from Shasta, Siskiyou, and Tehama counties, California. Some ore was reported as having been mined in Converse county, Wyoming. California ore is used principally in the manufacture of furnace linings.

**Uses of Chromium.**  
The main uses of chromium are in pigments and in connection with special tanning processes. It is also used in furnace linings, to a small extent in steel alloys, and in the manufacture of other alloys, among which is one known as "chromium bronze."

Though the domestic production of chromic iron ore in 1911 was small, the importations were large, amounting to 37,540 tons, valued at \$407,958. In addition chromic acid and bichromate of potash were imported to the value of \$3,508.

Chromic iron ore is widely distributed through areas of serpentine and associated basic rocks in different parts of the United States. Such areas have been found in a few localities in the old metamorphic rocks east of the Appalachian region from New England to Georgia; at various points in the Rock mountain region; throughout the extent of the Sierra Nevada and Coast Ranges in California, and at a few points in the Cascade mountains. It is widely disseminated through many of these areas, but only locally is it concentrated into workable deposits.

**Ore in Foreign Regions.**  
Within the last few years chromite has been produced outside of the United States mainly in New Caledonia, Rhodesia, Asia Minor, Russia, Greece, Canada, India, and Japan. Mr. Phalen's report contains a detailed account of the chromic iron ore of Rhodesia and New Caledonia, which at present are among the most

important countries, and also a description of the mines in Macedonia. A copy may be obtained by addressing the Director, United States Geological Survey, Washington, D. C.


