BIG

Improvements Are Being Made at Wesleyan College at Buckhannon.

BUCKHANNON, Aug. 23.—Work on the new gymnasium at the college is being rushed as rapidly as possible. The excavation has all been done, the swimming pool built, and the foundation walls commenced. The building is a large one, and it will be many years before the college will outgrow it. The new gym is located at the head of the driveway which passes the president's residence, and extends back to the old athletic field. The location for the new Science Hall has been selected. It is about 200 feet to the left of the gym as one goes into the grounds, and will be about as far from College avenue as the music hall stands. Architects are still at work on plans and specifications, but it is believed that work will be started on this building early in next month. Owing to the encroachment of the gym on the ground belonging to the athletic field, the field has been enlarged and rearranged. The idea of the college authorities at first was to swing the baseball diamond around, but some of the local baseball players pointed out the disadvantages of this, and it has now been decided to build the new diamond with the field in the same direction as formerly. The pitcher's box will be on ground formerly occupied by the grandstand. The old stand has been torn down and a new and larger one will be built 150 feet farther back than the old one. Most of the old fence has been torn down, and the field now looks pretty bad, covered as it is with debris and building material. It is proposed to make the new field so large that a one-fourth mile track may be built around the grounds inside the fence. A new fence will be built, and a smaller fence inside to keep spectators from the playing field. Wesleyan's athletic grounds, when completed, will be larger and better than those of any other school in the state.
