Horses Galore To Enter Here

As a Result of Secretary Cork's Visit to the Wheeling Fair.

H. E. Cork, speed secretary of the West Virginia Fair Association, has returned from the state fair at Wheeling. He reports fine success in his campaign for race horses at the fair here week after next. Sixty-five of the harness horses entered at the Wheeling fair will be at the Fairmont fair next week and they will all be brought from that city to Clarksburg for the fair here. Forty harness

horses go from the Wheeling fair to the fair at Washington, Pa., next week, and they will then be brought to the fair here. Still more harness horses are expected to enter here.

Mr. Cork announces that three car loads of runners will be brought here from Cumberland, where they are performing during home-coming week and one car will come from Washington, Pa., making a total of sixty-five or seventy runners.

Secretary Cork states that notwithstanding the fact that the association has 150 horse stalls, he is beginning to get worried over the problem of how to take care of all the racers as the prospect is that the stable grounds at the fair will be overrun with fast steeds.

The Curtiss birdman who performed at the Wheeling fair is the greatest dare-devil Mr. Cork ever saw. He had a talk with him and in the conversation Mr. Cork was told that Mr. Hamilton who will fly here was the tutor of the one who flew at Wheeling and is one of the greatest airmen in the world.


