


Mrs. Stealey Entertains.

SENATOR GRAY
May Run for the Presidency of the West Virginia Senate.

PARKERSBURG, Nov. 12.—Senator Joseph Gray, of Elizabeth, will probably be a candidate for president of the state senate when the legislature convenes at Charleston in January. He was in the city last night and said that while he had not fully determined to be a candidate he was considering the matter and if he decided to make the race he would announce soon.

"From the reports of the election received it is shown that I made the best race of any of the Republican senators," said Mr. Gray. "While this is not an indication of fitness for the place it shows that the people of the district supported me better than those of some of the other districts did their candidates. I will state definitely within a few days whether I will make the race."

ALLEGED YEGGS
Are Arrested and Jailed for Blowing An Iron Express Company Safe.

HINTON, Nov. 12.—On warrants signed by an Chesapeake and Ohio railroad agent, Henry Shepherd and Emmett Drumheled were arrested and lodged in jail following an investigation of the robbery Sunday of the Chesapeake and Ohio station at Pence Springs. The iron safe of the Adams Express Company, a cash register and other stolen articles were returned.

At Fayette robbers smashed the window of the Chesapeake and Ohio station and stole \$15.49 of Adams Express Company funds, \$159 of Chesapeake and Ohio funds, a gun and ammunition belonging to the operator, A. F. Bryson, and got away.


DIPHTHERIA FATAL.
