"SOCCER" FOOTBALL CLUB IS FORMING

The first meeting for the practice of the local Association Football Club is scheduled for Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock, January 5th. A number of celebrated players will be present and will join in the practice, among them being Shakespeare and Longmore, of fame throughout England, Keenan, formerly of St. Louis, and Tom McGregor, who played in the Junior International between England and Scotland. It is hoped that this first practice may be well attended, not only for the benefit of those desiring to learn the game, but to maintain and if possible increase the interest which has already been aroused. All available raw material will be used in the practice games, from which it is the intention to organize several teams. Games among the local players will be arranged, and later, match games with out-of-town teams.

An organization meeting will be held at the residence of William Shakespeare, 121 Kelly street, Friday night, January 3, at 8 o'clock. All interested, whether experienced or not, are invited to attend, and it is hoped that a large number will be present. For the information of those who are unacquainted with the game, it may be stated that the style of play is more open than that of Rugby, which tends to minimize the risk of injury, renders the game more interesting to the spectator, and at the same time affords all the elements necessary to a contest of speed, skill and endurance.

Association football, or "soccer," as it is sometimes called, is rapidly increasing in popularity in this country. For many years it has been the national game of England and her colonies, where the attendance at match or championship games often reaches or exceeds 100,000. Soccer has already superseded Rugby in many of the western colleges, especially those of the Pacific coast. It is noteworthy that when and wherever Soccer is played to any extent its popularity with both players and spectators steadily increases. It is confidently predicted that precedent with respect to the game will not be reversed when once it is fairly submitted to the Clarksburg public.
