SWINDLER

Whose Work is Widespread, this Man under Arrest is Alleged to Be.

CINCINNATI, O., Jan. 11—William Vokolek, arrested Wednesday by local detectives and Postoffice Inspector Griswold, on suspicion of being the leader of a band of men who who, during the last few years, operated one of the largest swindling games ever attempted in this country, has made a complete confession to the officers, following his identification by Postmaster Perry, of Chillicothe, O., in which city he worked last. Certain sections of the confession made by Vokolek the police refuse to make public at present in the hope of catching managers of the gang named by Vokolek as his co-workers, but the revelations which they did allow to become public are astonishing.

Among others, in 1909, when he was at Parkersburg, hearing that fourteen Hungarians had been killed by a dynamite explosion in Chillicothe, O., he repaired to that city, where he certified to the death of four of the men by calling them by the names of four of his supposed members, and by means of the men with whom he worked, who represented themselves as priests, physicians and undertakers, secured \$4,000 for this one job.

According to Postal Inspector Griswold, Vokolek, while representing himself as an organizer and agent of the Greek Catholic Union of Homestead, organized subordinate branches in a number of cities in Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky and West Virginia. Among the cities in which Vokolek is alleged to have operated and established branches of his insurance association, Griswold says, are Ironton, Gallipolis, Marietta and Point Pleasant, O.; Ashland, Catlettsburg and Lexington, Ky.; Huntington, Parkersburg and Beechwood, W. Va., and Jefferson, Ind.

JONES FUNERAL Was held at Clifford Osborn Chapel, Burial in Hepzibah Cemetery.

Funeral services over the body of Louis Jones, colored, who died at his home at Despard mine addition several days ago, was held at the Clifford-Osborn mortuary chapel Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock and the body was taken to Hepzibah on an interurban car, where it was buried by the side of his father in the Hepzibah cemetery.



AGED FARMER

Is a School Boy at Morgantown and a Minister Enrolls Also.

MORGANTOWN, Jan. 11—J. Van Horn, of Webster county, is the oldest man registered for the farmers' ten-day conference course at the university. Mr. Van Horn is 61 years old and is an active farmer. Dr. O. Dale King, presiding elder of the Morgantown district of the Methodist Episcopal church, is registered for the conference courses. In registering, Mr. King said he desired to give the members of the churches in his district, particularly of the rural section, the benefit of the lectures. The Rev. O. A. Kelly, of Morgantown, is also enrolled for the conference. The enrollment now totals twenty-five. Fifteen are enrolled in the agricultural short course which continues twelve weeks. Four boys are enrolled in the boys' course.

SMALLPOX

Afflicts Central Teamster Forty Days after He Was Quarantined.

CENTRAL STATION, Jan. 11—Frank Finley, who had been driving a team at Central Station, has been taken down with a case of smallpox at the home of his grandmother, Mrs. D. R. Wigner, near this place. Several weeks ago smallpox was traced to teamsters at the boarding house at Central Station, and the place was put under quarantine. Young Finley and several others were kept there under ban for twenty-seven days, but no new cases developed and Finley as well as the others was released from quarantine. Mr. Finley left Central Station and Monday before Christmas he arrived at Pike, where he has been since. This week he was taken down with the dreaded disease, forty odd days after he had been exposed.
