STUNG

Are Many Position Seekers by the Senate's Failure to Organize.

Information which has filtered from Clarksburg men who have been there and returned home, and through letters received in the city is to the effect that several hundred camp followers and job seekers in the capital are in bad straits as a result of the failure of the senate to organize and get down to business. When the special session of the legislature was opened more than two weeks ago scores of men and boys who had been promised clerkships and other jobs had reached the city and were quartered there waiting the distribution of the snaps, most of which pay daily wages higher than a first class mechanic can earn in eight hours of hard labor. Many of these had borrowed money enough to reach the capital and live for a few days and very few of them had enough capital to tide them over any length of time. Unable to secure their promised positions until the legislature actually began operations, the small back rolls of the job seekers steadily

dwindled, but none would forsake the field and return home, as they have lived each day hoping that the next would see them in a position to gain new credit through being on the state payroll. Now many of them do not even have money enough to return home on, and having borrowed all they possibly can from more fortunate friends, are in desperate circumstances indeed.
