## WESTON

WESTON, Feb. 21.—The regular inspection of Company A, West Virginia National Guard, will be held at the armory Monday night. A United States army officer will be in attendance.

**Republican Convention.**  
The Republican city executive committee has issued a call for a convention to be held Tuesday night, at the court house, for the purpose of nominating party candidates for the March election.

**Marriage Permits.**  
Marriage permits have been issued to Lloyd Byron Clem and Ida Helen Primm, T. A. Barrett and Minnie Lough, and Kirk Ours and Vista Gay Shoulders.

**Order of Owls.**  
Organization of a lodge of Owls has been perfected here with about 150 charter members.

**Crescent Loss Adjusted.**  
Adjusters representing the various insurance companies interested in the Crescent window glass factory fire of two weeks ago, met her and effected settlement with the company in the amount of \$41,000, including salvage, which will amount to about \$5,000. It is now expected that the Crescent management will decide in a few days whether or not the plant will be rebuilt.

The loss to the Crescent Window Glass Company is heavy, for the factory was valued at \$75,000, and was insured for less than seventy-five per cent of its cost. No. 2 factory, which was not touched by the flames, and which is valued at about \$100,000, was also under-insured, but this is being remedied by placing additional insurance with the same companies sustaining losses on the old building. The cause of the fire will probably never be known, but that the insurance underwriters lay no blame on the company, is evidenced by their readiness to write additional insurance on the remaining factory.

**Former Westonian Dead.**  
The many friends in this city of Mrs. E. G. Spaulding, who lived in this section practically all her life, up to six years ago, will learn with deep regret of her death at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Lucile Hyle, at Pittsburg, after a brief illness of pneumonia. Mrs. Spaulding left here to go to Texas, but recently took up her abode with her daughter in Pittsburg.

**Elias T. Bartlett.**  
Elias T. Bartlett, Civil war veteran, who was well and favorably known throughout this section, died suddenly at his home at Jane Lew Wednesday night. He was apparently in the best of health up to an hour before his death, which is attributed to heart failure.

**New Corporation.**  
Miss Mildred McCafferty, of Dayton, O., is a guest of Miss Margaret Cleary, of North Weston.
