STATES POLITICS IN THE CONGRESS

Is Very Decidedly Republican Now and May Be Solid Next Time.

(Special to the Telegram.)
WASHINGTON, D. C., Mar. 6.—Within a few weeks the Congress of the United States will meet in special session upon the call of the new president who has announced that he will have an extra session of Congress not later than April 1. The situation so far as West Virginia is concerned will be very different in the new Congress from what it has been in the last two years. In the Senate there will be one Democrat and one Republican senator from the state. In the House there will be four Republican members and two Democrats from West Virginia. What these Republican representatives may be able to accomplish for the people of their state remains to be seen for they will be minority members and subject to the wishes of the majority. At the same time the people of West Virginia may be assured that they will, so far as possible, look after the best interests of their constituents and follow the policies of the Republican party in all their actions, either in the Senate or the House. It will be much more like the old times when West Virginia had a solid Republican delegation in Congress than it has seemed in the last two years. Possibly when the next congressional election occurs the Republicans may again obtain a majority in both the Senate and the House, and if West Virginia is in line, the Republican delegation from that state will then be in a position to accomplish a great deal even though at the present time it is not situated so that much may be expected of it.
