**FUN ENOUGH FOR
A "ROUGH HOUSE"**

In Screaming Pullman Car
Farce "Excuse Me," Ap-
pearing at Grand:

With enough fun and cutting up to
make a "rough house" and reminding
one of the old Hoyt farce comedies—
the first year out—Henry W. Savage's
production of the Pullman-train com-
edy, "Excuse Me," was presented last
night at the Robinson Grand and it
was highly pleasing and amusing to
an audience that filled the house.

The play is frankly a farce with no
apologies for being such. Nor is any
apology needed. On the contrary,
gratitude is due all concerned in the
exploitation of "Excuse Me" for the
happy entertainment it provides. It
is at the same time a satirical farce
as Rupert Hughes, the author, with
copious dashes of human nature, plays
upon the woes of the American travel-
ing public. That Americans are the
best natured people on earth is pretty
well proved by the fact that they have
continued so long to suffer the mis-
eries of sleeping cars. And how when
a witty playwright shows them
squirming on the grill they acknowl-
edge the joke is on them more and
more.

An entirely capable company of
actors makes up the cast and the novel
stage settings, showing the interior of
an Overland Limited on the Union
Pacific railroad en route from Chicago
to the Pacific coast, are faithfully re-
presented.

Among the Paul J. Rainey African
hunt pictures, which are to be shown
Thursday, Friday and Satur-
day afternoons and nights at

the Robinson Grand is one of the
herd of several hundred Thompson
gaselles, which are declared by scien-
tists to be the most timid creatures in
the world. The photographs were
taken seventy-five yards distant from
these animals and never before has
man been in such close proximity to
the timid animals, which are said to
be of so nervous a physical character,
that the shot of a gun oftentimes fright-
ens them to death.

Another picture discloses a baby
rhino that was captured. It was
brought up by a native of the Kavanda
tribe. The moment the native left
the kraal, the rhino began uttering
plaintive cries, and was not appeased
until the negro returned to it. The
baby rhino is now in the London Zoo-
logical Garden.

It was proven by these pictures that
the lion, which has always been re-
garded as the king of beasts, turned
coward when brought to bay by a pack
of Mississippi boar hounds.

"The Texas Cattle King" which ap-
pears tonight at the Robinson Grand,
is presented without the assistance of
the gun fighter so common to the
writers of western plays. All the
Jesse James element has been elim-
inated and the play is far superior to
the old time melodrama, in the fact
that the story is truthfully told and
presented by a company of performers
who know the West as it is and was
at the time the play was written. The
costumes and scenery are correct in
every detail, and no item, however
small, has been neglected, to make
this play one of the best of its kind.

**CIRCUS HAS
NEW PARADE**

Great Spectacular Street
Pageant is Three Miles
in Its Length.

In novelty, costliness and bril-
liancy, the parade which the Ringling
Brothers are presenting this season is
a marvel of achievement. It far

Vienna, Calcutta, Hongkong, Buenos
Aires and Cape Town.

This season it has 375 performers.
Over 300 of these are making their
first tour of America. There are
artists from Germany, France, Italy,
Norway, Holland, Spain, Belgium,
Australia, Greece, Syria, Turkey, Ja-
pan, South Africa, South America,


