INCIDENT

Of a Very Touching Nature in Circles of European Royalty.

ROME, April 26.—Another incident to royalty which has provoked widespread discussion befell Princess Isabella, duchess of Genoa, recently.

A year ago the duchess was passing on foot through her country place, on the outskirts of a tiny village, when her attention was attracted to a party of strolling acrobats, quite as much by their poverty as by the cleverness of their tricks. She watched them for some time, then made an appointment with their leader for them all to come to the castle and perform. This they accepted eagerly.

They kept the appointment. The duchess was quite at home with them, listened to their stories, gave them a good dinner, paid them well and sent them away with new clothes. Then she forgot all about them.

Months passed. One day the duchess was horribly burned as the liquid with which she was rubbing her arm for rheumatism caught fire. Throughout the kingdom it was published that the wound was an ugly one and that it showed little disposition to heal. She was very ill for weeks. When she was recovering the duke received a coarse and dirty envelope, addressed
