Subjoined is today's official report of the condition of the city water, in connection with which the city water works and sewerage board authorizes the following statement: The board wishes every citizen to know the benefits of the pure, clear water supplied to them. It urges Clarksburgers to use it freely in the coming summer as the sewerage, dust, dirt and sulphur that find their way into the wells and surface water from which many are still drinking are of the greatest danger to the public health.

The board also wishes every citizen to know that the clear water supplied is the result of long years of experience of able men and that the board is doing all in its power to give the benefit of that experience.
