RANSELL RAPS HIS PARTY MEN

Accuses Them with Being in League with the Greedy Sugar Trust.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 3.—Senator Ransdell, of Louisiana, in a speech last evening discharged verbal broadsides at the so-called "Sugar Trust," declared the free sugar schedule of the tariff bill "violated the pledge of the Baltimore platform not to destroy legitimate industry" and declared that in supporting free sugar "the Democratic party will be playing into the hands of the Sugar Trust and other refiners."

Mr. Ransdell made the statement that the cane industry of Louisiana supported "half a million souls"; that the beet sugar industry employed 150,000 people with 500,000 dependent upon it and that 200,000 people in Hawaii depended on sugar.

Directly attacking the so-called sugar trust, Senator Ransdell reviewed the customs frauds, and the government's anti-trust suits against the American Sugar Refining Company and declared that former Attorney General Wickersham had referred to some of the refiners as "criminals of unparalleled depravity."

Senator Ransdell contended that the framers of the Baltimore platform did not contemplate free sugar, and declared that after competition had been eliminated, the price would be raised.

Is a Jonah to a Former County Resident and Well Known Salesman.

MT CLARE, June 3.—H. C. Bruesharber, who for eighteen years has been representing a shoe company in central West Virginia, was here yesterday looking after his trade.

This makes the second time he has been visited by calamity since living there. Less than two years ago his home was wrecked by a cyclone which visited that section, and members of his family had a narrow escape from death.

At considerable expense he rebuilt his home only to be carried away by the raging flood-tide.

When the city was almost ruined by the flood, Mr. Bruesharber was in Nebraska. His wife and two daughters, seventeen and twelve years old, were alone when the waters surrounded their home. Shortly after climbing to the roof for safety the building was washed considerable distance and lodged near some burning buildings.

For thirty-six hours they were marooned in this position before they could be reached by rescuing parties. He reports that his daughters have fully recovered from the terrible experience, but that Mrs. Bruesharber is still in a hospital and he fears she will remain an invalid.
